Paul's Health Center

A New Beginning for Joy Uganda's Special Education Ministry

Joy Uganda has built a primary health clinic called Paul's Health Center to protect the lives of children at Yedam Elementary School.

Nearly 1,000 children study at the school. Because there had been no basic health facility on campus, it was difficult to respond quickly in emergencies. Last year, a student tragically lost his life to malaria.

In response, Paul's Health Center was established. A nurse will be stationed at the clinic to provide ongoing care and immediate emergency response.
